Great Reads @ Trinity

I am doing something different this month. There are two books by Ann H. Gabhart that I would like to introduce. The first, "These Healing Hills," was published in 2017; the second, "An Appalachian Summer," came out in 2020. Both books deal with an organization founded by Mary Breckenridge in 1925 called Frontier Nursing Service. The nurses working for FNS provided midwifery and general nursing care to people in a remote seven-hundred-square-mile area of southeastern Kentucky, and often traveled on horseback. The organization eventually evolved into a hospital (1928), and a Graduate School of Midwifery which later expanded to include a program in primary-care nursing in 1970. The characters in these two books are fictional, but the Frontier Nursing Service in which they work is real.

In "These Healing Hills," Francine is looking for a fresh start when the man she loves brings home an English bride in 1945. She finds her healing with the FNS and a new love as well.

"An Appalachian Summer" begins in Louisville, Kentucky in 1933 with Piper's debutant ball. She signs up for a summer with FNS, not as a nurse but as a horseback messenger for the nurses in a time when there were no phones and often no electricity in the remote mountains. Her desire is to make a decision about her future. Should she honor her parents' wishes and marry a wealthy man who is looking for a high-society wife? Or should she follow her heart and marry the man she has known all her life who is a poorly-paid teacher and artist?

Each book stands alone. Both are good examples of Christian historical romance fiction.

R-remember sunscreen.



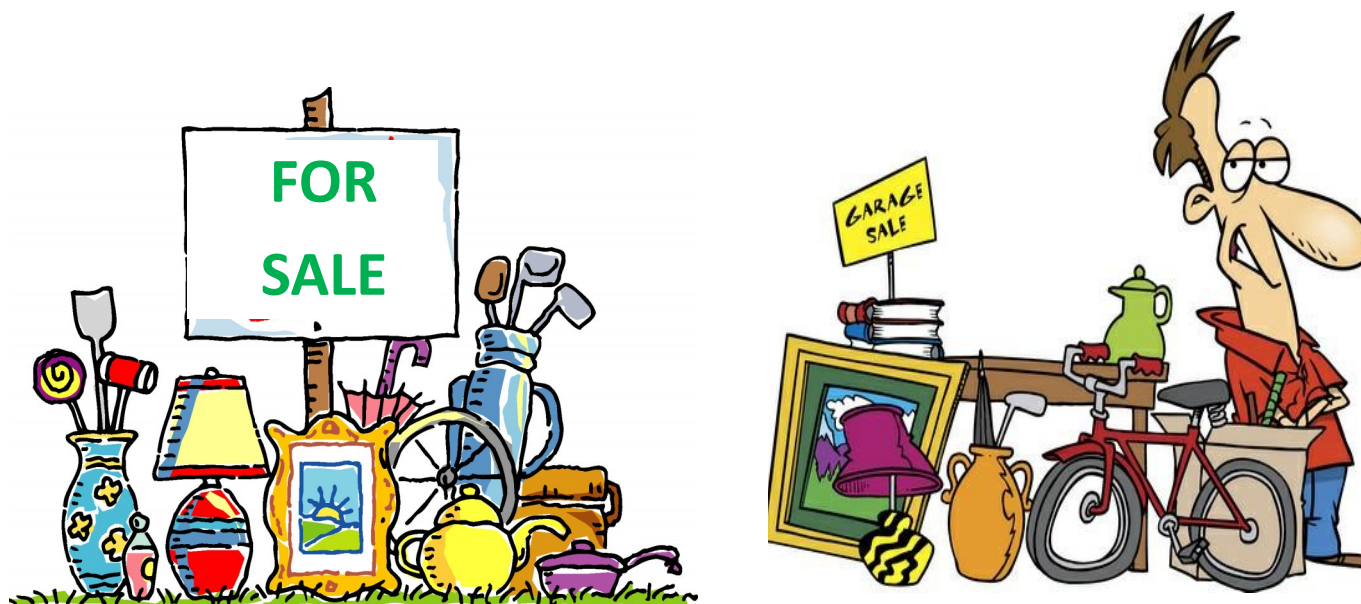
