# Great Reads @ Trinity By Jean Best

I picked up a book in Trinity's library and read this on the back cover: "A twenty-six word parade of hope: beginning with God, ending with life, and urging us to do the same. Brief enough to write on a napkin or memorize in a moment, yet solid enough to weather 2,000 years of storms and questions. If you know nothing about the Bible, start here. If you know everything in the Bible, return here.

Do you have any idea which scripture is being described? It's John 3:16, and the book is "3:16 The Numbers of Hope" by Max Lucado. I have my own copy on my bookshelf at home. It was a Christmas gift in 2008 from my nephew, Steve, and I have read it again and again, gleaning something new each time.

The book begins with what Max says is, "The most famous conversation in the Bible". It's the one early in the ministry of Jesus when Nicodemus, a Jewish religious leader, seeks out Jesus after dark one night. He recognizes that Jesus is special and wants to know more. Part of what he hears is John 3:16. Chapter by chapter the book follows in detail that 26-word scripture and ends with a chapter that speaks of the hope we are given in John 3:16 that in believing in Jesus we will have eternal life in heaven with Him.

There is a wonderful bonus at the very end of the book—forty days of devotions. Lucado says of these devotions: "Having dedicated the book to the deep drilling of one of Jesus's statements, I want us to conclude with a flyby read of His entire life—from the Bethlehem manger to the vacated tomb," I have read the devotions every time I have read the book, and I hope you will too. Please don't worry about how long you have had the book. Just soak it all in.
